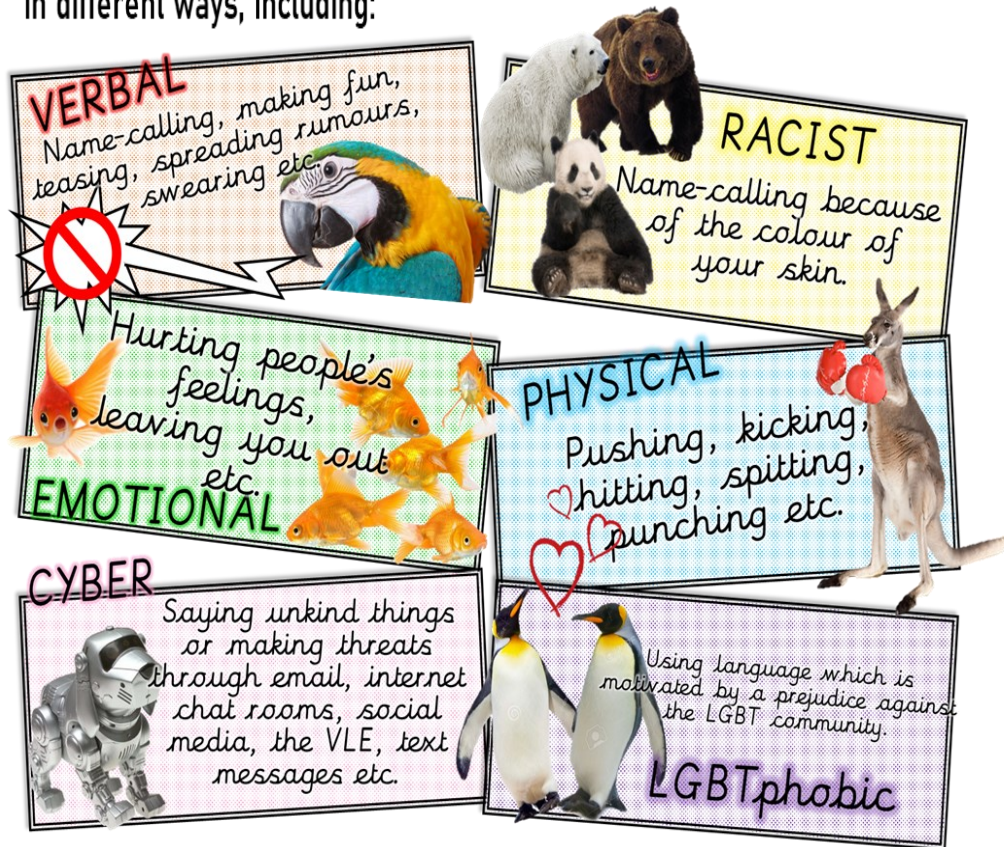


# What is Bullying?

# Child Friendly Anti-Bullying Policy



This child-friendly Anti-Bullying Policy is in place so that everybody within our school community knows what bullying is and what to do should bullying occur. It is important that all pupils, staff, parents and carers have a shared definition of bullying and know that any incidents will be dealt with quickly and effectively.

## Who can I tell if I am being bullied?

A friend

A teacher

Someone at home

Any adult

## What happens to the person doing the bullying?

Pupils at OHS are made aware of the consequences of bullying-which include:

- \* Say sorry to the victim
- \* Lose points
- \* No option choice on a Friday
- \* Contact Parents/Carers
- \* Behaviour contract drawn up
- \* Withdrawn from joining in on school visits, activities, clubs or events

Staff will talk to the bully and make sure that they understand their actions.

If any of the points above have not stopped the person from bullying and the bullying is very serious, the pupil may end up being excluded!

## When is it bullying?

## What should I do if I am being bullied?

1) Ask them to stop if you can.

2) Stay calm and walk away from the situation.

3) Talk to your friends about what is happening.

4) Tell any trusted adult that works at Oakfield House School
